Boat Trailers (Good Cop Version)

Members can store their boat trailers (with or without boats) on club property under the following conditions:

Monthly fee will rise to \$20 per trailer per month effective January first. One reason for the increase (from \$10) is to hopefully reduce the number of trailers. We are running out of space.

In order to give the treasurer a fighting chance to keep up with fees, you MUST have your initials painted on the tongue of your trailer. If you will contact the Treasurer, Vice-Commodore or Hal Normand, we will stencil your initials on your trailer for you.

Even easier, if you will stick a piece of masking tape on your trailer tongue and write your initials (sharpie, pencil, ballpoint) we will stencil them.

Weed whack or mow the grass under your trailer. The mowing crew will take care of the spaces around the trailers but you need to keep your trailer space tidy. No junk storage. Keep your tires inflated.

Don't park your trailer where it blocks the road or prevents other members from using their trailer. This applies to the entire club property.

Summary: Pay your fee. Initial your trailer. Maintain your trailer space. Park properly.

Boat Trailers (Bad Cop Version)

Boat trailer storage is out of control. Lake Worth Sailing Club is not a wrecking yard or a landfill. We have gotten rid of a number of abandoned boats but abandoned trailers are taking up space we can use for paying member storage. This includes board boats on trailers.

If you are storing a trailer/boat and not paying your parking fee, you are stealing from the club.

If you don't have your initials painted on your trailer tongue or if you are parked illegally, your trailer is considered abandoned and will be treated as junk.

NEW RATE CHANGES

A lot of members don't read their e-mails so I'm hoping some of those Non-Readers might actually read the Tiller. For 2020 the rate for Trailer Spaces (with or without a boat on it) will increase from \$10 a month, to \$20 a month.

Board Boats and Catamaran spaces won't increase to \$15 a month until 2023. Wet Slip rates won't change until 2034. All of the rate schedules are listed in Article IV, Section 4 of the club's By-Laws. If you have automatic check payments for your dues, please don't forget to reflect the new rate for your January payment.
